The Corruption of Foreign Public Officials Act (CFPOA), the Canadian legislative response to the OECD Anti-Bribery Convention, has been in force, in Canada, since 14 February 1999. This Act makes it a criminal offence to bribe a foreign public official. Such offences carry a five-year maximum term of imprisonment, an unlimited fine and are extraditable. Yet, corruption in international business transactions continues. To date, there has been only one conviction under this Act. What is the Canadian Government doing to alert Canadian companies to the Act and its consequences? What advice can you offer to ensure Canadian companies become more aware?
